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






From the desk of Dr. R. G. Anand

The COVID-19 pandemic tragically continues to surge in India. The strict lock down protocols may have stunted the transmission of the disease in some parts of the country, but the coronavirus continues to spread. During times of crisis, systemic inequities intensify. The most vulnerable and marginalized populations carry a disproportionate share of the hardship—and are often left out of response and recovery efforts.

Being cognizant of the multi-fold challenges faced by vulnerable communities to recover from the after-effects of this crisis, I have continued my humanitarian aid assistance in personal capacity (and funding) to address these unfortunate challenges with the motto, 'Seva Parmo Dhara' while upholding the dignity of each citizen.

After serving as Member (NCPCR) from 2018-2020, I continue to be determined in my efforts to collectively support and promote the government's call and further the benefits of their schemes by leading similar initiatives in congruence with the vision of Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi for children's education, health and nutrition and translating them on-ground for the underprivileged children. Based on the heterogeneous needs of the different slums and communities, the pulse of each community's needs was identified and localized solutions were rolled out, including providing essential health and food services, and building awareness of COVID-19 as well as responding to education needs made by children homes.

Beyond the pandemic's context, in the last 6 months, I have expanded the outreach of my humanitarian aid to promote and strengthen digital infrastructure in children homes. Another focused intervention has been installation of automatic hand sanitizer dispenser that has been actively donated to various child care institutions and as a preventive measure to continue practice safe hygiene habits among children. As a medical doctor and public health activist, medical camps have been set-up at various locations in and around Tamil Nadu. A conscious call to extend humanitarian support and relief for disaster preparedness and response during Chennai rains and floods was also proactively addressed. Encouraging community engagement and collaborating with local leaders, district administrations, NGOs and karyakarthas, for distribution of dry ration, food, books and disseminating information about essential health and other social services, such as nearby hospitals or health centres, food distribution sites, and safe transportation options was actively conducted.

In this bi-annual report, I am pleased to share the 6 months' humanitarian aid and response extended as a part of 'Seva hi Sangathan' programme in the six southern states and UTs of India by adopting a unique community empowering model with the goal to continue improving the health and lives of the underserved who face social and financial challenges.

It is important to understand that the recovery from the pandemic is likely to be a multiyear, multistakeholder effort. Thus, it is becoming more important than ever to join hands and collaborate with civil society, government, and communities to drive impact. I will continue to work relentlessly and passionately towards the vision of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikaas.

Executive

Summary

his report depicts the comprehensive humanitarian response and aid contributed from the period of July to December 2021 to honour Bharatiya Janata Party's 'Seva hi Sangathan' programme. The activities were spread across six southern states and a UT. The activities ensured to support the most underprivileged sections of the society in two inextricably tied dimensionshealthcare and education. Major activities undertaken in the two areas of impact sectors include:

Education



Apart from preventive measure, in a first, there has been a regional-level program implemented to promote education for the vulnerable children. To promote and build greater access and latest **digital infrastructure, smart boards have been installed in children's homes.** So far, it has been carried out in a total of 6 states and UTs namely, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala and Karnataka.

Long-term vision is to expand and encourage digital infrastructure at other regions in the future. Thus, this marks the first-phase of digital education promotion specifically for the vulnerable child populations in children homes and orphanages. Distribution of education kits comprising school books and stationary items has only been supported during visits to various orphanages.



Health

There is an increased outreach of humanitarian aid and support extended in the last six months in the field of health. Hundreds of carefully assembled nutritional food and dry ration packets have been distributed to the underprivileged sections of the society.

Another targeted intervention has been the installation of automatic hand sanitizer dispensers, which have been actively donated to various child care institutions and used as a preventive strategy to ensure that children continue to practise good hygiene practises.



Medical camps have been set up in and around Tamil Nadu as a result of Dr. Anand's work as a medical practitioner and public health campaigner especially during the time of dengue. During the Chennai rains and floods, a proactive call was made to give blankets, accommodation, health checkups and ration and encouraging community participation and collaboration to mitigate the after-effects of the disaster.

Promoting Digital Infrastructure in Children Homes (CCI)



Encouraging the transformation of children homes by installation of Smart boards to promote accessibility and ease via digital learning. Distribution of education kits comprising school books and stationary. a proposal has been formulated to provide Smart Board and support numerous Child Care Institutions in all 38 districts of Tamil Nadu. As next steps, this proposal will be scaled to all 14 Districts in Kerala and 4 Districts in Puducherry. Total 56 Districts will be empowered through this initiative to support digital education infrastructure in CCIs.

Community Engagement and Relief Work



Distribution of food and dry ration packet. Extend humanitarian support and food, blankets and accommodation relief as a response aid during Chennai rains and floods. Promoting, influencing and informing government actions on community needs, preventive health measures and access to public services by collaborating with local community leaders and BJP youth wing karyakarthas. ADDRESSING THE HEALTH AND NUTRITIONAL VULNERABILITIES OF VARIOUS COMMUNITY GROUPS

01. Food & Ration Aid

OVID-19 is putting an unprecedented burden on health systems around the world and causing disruptions to essential routine health and nutrition services, which could result in children, particularly the most marginalised, missing out on life-saving services.

Further, rising economic insecurity and food shortages due to the pandemic are preventing families from providing their children with the nutrition that is needed for their physical and mental development.

During the pandemic, we have been hard at work identifying and helping the most disadvantaged individuals, especially sustenance. This includes communities of migrant workers, daily wage laborers, domestic helps, construction workers, trans-persons in need, children, elderly and the destitute in care homes, orphanages and foster homes.

We have primarily focused on meeting the macro and micro-nutrient needs of the communities as we believe that adequate nutrition has been the need of the hour during these testing times. Hence, the food packets were assembled keeping in mind the nutritional content that benefits these vulnerable sections. The packets included: eggs, fruits, pulses, grains and cereals. The table shows the nutrition content.

02. Mobile Medical Camp



Based on strong primary care background and understanding of the public health functioning, Dr. Anand has developed an Innovative and first of its kind initiative, NAMO CARE. Under this, a critical service feature is Free Mobile Medical Camp. Health Camp is one of the most important feature of this scheme because of its wise accessibility.

Health camps are done with an objective of bringing awareness among the rural masses about the diseases they are suffering from, screening and providing free medical advice, medicines and making referrals to hospitals PHC/CHCs based on cases.

Mobile camps is an integrated curative and preventive health care to the rural population with emphasis on preventive and promotive aspects of health care services available to them and reducing their out-of-pocket expenditures for medical treatment.

SERVICES: Basic Consultation, Screening, support for purchasing medicines, Patient referral to secondary or tertiary hospitals, organizing awareness outreach programs, providing IEC (Information, Education and Communication) to public on health aspects. So far, total: 95 camps in 93 districts.



03. Sanitizer Dispensers

One of the best ways to stay healthy during the pandemic is to wash your hands with soap and water. But if those aren't available, hand sanitizer may help rid your hands of germs that can cause COVID-19.

After the second wave, it was pertinent to keep continuing the habits of keeping hands cleans and following WHO protocols. Thus, as a community awareness and preventive measure, 10 automatic hand sanitizer dispenser units were donated to children's homes while inaugurating smart boards there.

It was a reminder to keep practicing safe and healthy habits. This small move directed towards vulnerable children was ensured to encourage healthy behaviours. It will keep them safe and their surroundings safer.

This also encouraged a peer support model where children encouraged others to use it before entering classes, play areas and other premises of children homes.



Digital Education with SMART BOARD

An initiative for promoting digital education infrastructure in children's homes by introducing smart boards. A knowledge board for *Atmanirbhar Bharat*. Empowerment of children in child care institutions with equal access to digital and e-learning resources.



Taking inspiration from our Hon'ble PM Sh. Narendra Modi and his encouragement to Digital India, we've encourged digital education infrastructure to vulnerable children residing in children homes as a first large-scale education initiative in line with New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and its emphasis on Digital education.

Education is the key to human development and empowerment of the society. For the children who are in need of care and protection and staying in the Child Care Institutions (CCIs); education and knowledge can play a transformative role in their lives.

Moreover, imparting knowledge and education through the medium of "Smart Board" which is in fact a "Knowledge Board" can have multiple positive impact in the lives of children including:

- Develop knowledge and experience in digital technology,
- 2. Audio-visual learning,
- 3. Scientific temperament, and new experiments etc.
- 4. Improve motivation, skills attendance, and creativity,
- 5. Support different learning styles and special needs.

In addition to that, smart

boards can screen the video contents on science, technology, innovations, mathematics, social science as well as knowledge of culture, tradition, inspirational stories etc. It can be a great for teachers to make the lessons interactive and engage children using the Smart Board.

It may be mentioned that the concept of Digital Smart Board meets the basic principles and pillars of Atma Nirbhar Bharat

Special thanks to Sh. Kummanam Ji for joining me and being instrumental in scaling knowledge board initiative in 2 Children homes in Kerala. His words have been a big source of motivation for me to continue my efforts in right direction.

As next steps, this proposal will be scaled to all 14 Districts in Kerala and 4 Districts in Puducherry. Total 56

Districts will be empowered through this initiative to support digital education infrastructure in CCIs.

Thereby, enabling and empowering children from underprivileged sections of the society to achieve the goal towards making an Atma Nirbhar Bharat and supporting them with best possible educational aid and latest technology.

Community Health Drive: NAMO CARE

A community health initiative started during COVID-19 pandemic, NAMO CARE drive envisages achievement of universal access to equitable, affordable & quality health care services that are accountable and responsive to people's needs. Major focus is to address the health and nutritional needs of the affected population.

The COVID-19 pandemic presents a dual set of challenges: a public health emergency resulting from the direct consequences of the virus and, at the same time, a socio-economic crisis resulting from the drastic measures governments have been forced to take to prevent the spread of the disease.

COVID-19 is therefore a health, social and economic crisis all at the same time. It is driving many more people into poverty, vulnerability and displacement, creating major suffering. The economic consequences of the pandemic might be more devastating than the disease itself. Livelihoods have been destroyed at an unprecedented rate and COVID-19 is having a severe impact on global hunger levels.

Thus, there was a need for empowering vulnerable communities with equitable access to both health and education. NAMO CARE provides a comprehensive health response to COVID-19 pandemic as well as overall community health issues.

NAMO CARE supports communities living in densely populated urban slum colonies or predominately rural populations at district level who have had limited work opportunities and reduced access to food after the second surge of the COVID-19 pandemic. These populations are predominately migrant workers, marginalized and displaced individuals, and orphaned and vulnerable children. These communities have experienced food shortage and income loss as factories were closed, and small businesses were unable to work out of the streets.

During COVID-19, first and second waves, Dr. Anand enabled an integrated healthcare response – which means enhancing community awareness about vaccination, essential guidelines to wear mask, social distancing etc. to prevent transmission of Covid-19 virus. Also, equipping front line workers with PPE kits, masks and other medical resources.

With decades of experience in community medicine, mobile health camps in districts were organized for primary care especially testing for overt symptoms of covid such as fever, drop in oxygen levels etc. Focus was also on enhancing testing capacity and referral as well as augmenting treatment facilities across select-regions. Referrals were made to PHC/CHCs based on assessment.

The nutritional needs of the vulnerable populations were also taken care and more than 2000+ ration packets have been distributed.

An integrated healthcare response was ramped up focusing on tackling stigma and myths surrounding vaccinations. Vaccination drives have been promoted and so far conducted in 3 districts: Hassan, Chitradurga and Bangalore Rural district, Karnataka


